## Health Requirements

1. A Scrapie Flock ID (previously the Scrapie Premise ID) is required for all goat owners in Illinois. Call (217) 241-6689 (other states call your respective state veterinarian's office).
2. A National Animal Identification System (NAIS) Premise ID can be acquired by contacting USDA, APHIS. This is a voluntary program.
3. All out of state animals require an entry permit. Permits available Monday - Friday, 8 AM-4:30 PM at (217) 782-4944.
4. Market wethers and commercial does **MUST** have a SCRAPIE ID TAG in their ear.
5. All exhibitors must furnish official health certificates as required by Illinois state law, given to the superintendent immediately upon arrival at the show.
6. Animals are subject to rejection from the fairgrounds for appearance of contagious disease at the discretion of the superintendents. This includes but is not limited to severe diarrhea, pink eye, sore mouth, or fungus in any stage or abscess in any stage.
7. All animals will be released after the show.
8. ABGA Rules shall govern.
9. All animals entered in the ABGA Sanctioned classes must be registered with the ABGA. Exhibitors must how original certificates of registration. No tattooing at the show. Animals with illegible tattoos or tattoos not matching their registration certificate will be excused. Tags and tattoos must match weight card.
10. The Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act prohibits physical mistreatment of animals. Persons mistreating goats will be prohibited from exhibiting and/or lose their award.
11. **The Superintendents reserve the right to expel persons from the show for unethical or unsportsmanlike conduct.**
